MINUTES

Town Council Regular Meeting

May 6, 2014 at 6:00 p.m.

Council Chambers – Springdale Town Hall, 2915 Platt Springs Road

The media and public were duly notified of the date, time, and place of this meeting.

MEMBERS PRESENT: Mayor Michael Bishop, Mayor Pro-Tem Manos, Councilmembers Wilkerson, Reeley, and Sox-Peters, Interim Town Administrator Joe Boyes, and Town Attorney Danny Scott.

MEMBERS ABSENT: Councilmembers Hallman and Ricard.

I. Call to Order

Mayor Bishop called the meeting to order at 6 p.m. A quorum was present. Mayor Bishop provided the invocation and led the Pledge of Allegiance. The Agenda was approved without objection.

II. Approval of Minutes

A. The minutes from the April 1, 2014 meeting were approved as submitted.

III. Presentations and Requests for Appearance

A. Mr. Kislaya Sinha – Super 8 Progress Update. Mr. Sinha provided an update of the renovation and construction of the former Cambridge Plaza to a Super 8 hotel.

IV. Unfinished Business

A. Consideration of Ordinance O-14-02, an ordinance amending Ch.7 Elections, Section 7-23. - Time of taking office; contested election. Council made no motion on this item.

B. Consideration of Ordinance O-14-03, an ordinance amending Ch. 14 Nuisances [**SECOND READING**]. Council, on motion by Mayor Pro Tem Manos, seconded by Councilmember Wilkerson, voted unanimously to approve Ordinance O-14-03, an ordinance amending Ch. 14 Nuisances.

C. Consideration to amend the Penny for Progress submissions. Council, on motion from Councilmember Wilkerson, seconded by Councilmember Reeley, voted unanimously to amend the Penny for Progress submissions to support a fully-funded municipal complex.

D. Consideration of the Platt Springs Rd. Lighting Proposal. Council, on motion from Mayor Pro Tem Manos, seconded by Councilmember Peters, voted unanimously to approve the Platt Springs Rd. Lighting Proposal to install streetlights on Platt Springs from Kirkwood to Sightler.

V. New Business

A. Consideration of Ordinance O-14-04, An ordinance to provide for the adoption of a Town operating budget, its execution, and effect, for the fiscal period July 1, 2014 through June 30, 2015. Council, on motion of Councilmember Reeley, seconded by Mayor Pro Tem Manos, voted unanimously to approve Ordinance O-14-04, an ordinance to provide for the adoption of a Town operating budget, its execution, and effect, for the fiscal period of July 1, 2014 through June 30, 2015.

B. Consideration of P-14-02 Peace Officers' Memorial Day. Council, on motion of Councilmember Peters, seconded by Councilmember Wilkerson, voted unanimously to approve P-14-02, a proclamation recognizing Peace Officers' Memorial Day.

C. Springdale Elementary Fund Run Donation Request. Council, on motion of Mayor Pro Tem Manos, Seconded by Councilmember Peters, voted unanimously to donate \$500 for the Fund Run.

VI. Reports

A. Town Council Reports. Mayor Bishop had several events and attended multiple meetings in April.

B. Administrator's Report. Administrator Boyes reported that he issued business license denial letters for two businesses and that the business license ordinance allows for an appeal of the decision. Administrator Boyes informed Council that the appointment of Kevin Key to the Planning Commission left a vacancy on the Design Review Board and the Town would be taking applications for the Council's consideration. Lastly, he informed Council of several upcoming meetings and events.

C. Public Works Director's Report. Public Works Director Ancik reported on recent trimming done by the Public Works Department and that the Department would be looking to hire seasonal help for the summer. He invited volunteers to assist the Department with its landscaping projects during the summer.

D. Chief's Report. Chief Cornett reviewed his monthly report and statistics with the Council.

VII. Public Comment

Mr. Leon Moore spoke on the need for more sewer and road work in the Town. Mr. Andy Ranck requested an update on the closing of Beverly Drive and Mayor Bishop informed him that the petition has been completed and letters received from the Railroad and now the Town is awaiting a cost estimate from Lexington County before moving forward. Mr. Doug Hook spoke in favor of the Beverly Drive closing.

VIII. Adjournment

Council, upon motion of Councilmember Reeley, seconded by Councilmember Wilkerson, voted unanimously to adjourn the meeting at 6:55 pm.
